




Between Us by Vincent Lagrange 'My aim is not so much to photograph animals, but to capture the emotional life and soul of these beautiful creatures and to apply my own meaning to it. In doing so, I hope to highlight the strong affinity between our species and the rest of the animal kingdom. To prevent any distractions, I

take my images of these animals under studio conditions, which requires considerable preparation. On location, we construct several temporary studios equipped with sober, handpainted backgrounds and a sophisticated, minimalist lighting set-up that focuses all the attention

of each animal. A secretary bird requires a different approach than a gorilla. During this process, I develop a personal bond with the animal I am photographing a relationship that I aim to share with you through my photography.


